Answers for Second Paper

1. Zechariah and Mary

Zechariah was overwhelmed and testified and he did not believe and due to this he became dumb.

 - (ii) Good news to the poor Jesus addressed the poor people and did his teaching in open areas and gave them new hope.
 - (iii) Freed the oppressed He worked towards bringing relief to the people who were oppressed by laws and taxes

Freedom to the captives – He brought back to society the women, children and sick who were bound by laws of the society.

Sight to the blind – He gave sight to the physically blind, and they became his followers. Tax collectors and Pharisees, who were blinded by sin, Jesus showed them their sins, and moved them to the loosed path. Even to his disciples he showed the correct path.

(iii) Poor - The Kingdom of God could be established by fulfilling their needs.

Oppressed – By being a voice for the oppressed people like estate workers, people working in factories those who are working in the Middle East, try to bring relief to them.

Captives – Guiding the people in to the correct path particularly those who are obsessed by wealth, power and worldly things. Helping the drug and alcohol addicts to overcome their addiction by taking them to rehabilitation centers.

Blind – Those who are blinded by sin and who are unaware of God's word; direct them to the corrected path. Pray for them.

Paul took the leadership in Malta for the hospitality shown by the people and healed the sick and the father of Publius.
